- The UNM Best Practices Rubric is assessed by a review team, with processes established by the Online Course Advisory Council and results reported to you.
- Stipends are generally available for full or part of term courses 8 to 16 weeks in length and for 3 credits
- Stipends are not available for programs or courses receiving development funds from other sources
- The stipend is transferred to the faculty's college when the course is fully developed and has passed CDL review.
- Course must pass CDL review by the stated deadline. Deadlines are in the approval memo sent to the department and available at the UNM Online website for deadlines
- Distribution of development stipends to faculty is at the discretion of both the college and the faculty's department
